SUBJECT INFORMATION

BIBLE

6TH GRADE

We have finished ten lessons, and have done the corresponding test for each one!

Our students will continue turning in their Workbook every other Friday; please remind them to complete all assigned sections.

All lessons are reviewed in class: we do the Bible Scripture reading, lesson book and discussion and review and answer the questions in class. Those questions are the same questions they receive on Friday's Bible Test- please have them learn and review the guide through out the week, along with the weekly Bible Verse- this verse can be said to me or written in the test.

7TH GRADE

We have covered the first six units in our Bible curriculum. Please remind students to study their bible verses and recite them by Friday of the week they are assigned. Bible verses count 100% the week they are due, seventy percent (one week late), fifty percent (two weeks late), and no credit after three weeks. Students are still required to say past due verses, but will receive no credit.

8TH GRADE

As a reminder, the Bible tests are usually on Friday over that week's lesson and verses are due on Thursday. The lesson is taught on Mondays and Tuesdays. Please encourage your student to remain on schedule with their verses. The verses that they are memorizing not only go along with the lessons, but they will be said at graduation.

HISTORY

SEDAM

6TH GRADE

We have started Chapter 5 on Ancient China. We are learning about the locations, inventions and ways of life during this civilization. The chapter will teach of the wonderful ways the Chinese lived and how Biblically different they were in their beliefs. A Chapter test will follow by the end of the month. Students will be doing a small project on this chapter.

US HISTORY

We are working out of the History textbook on Chapter 6 focusing on Colonial life. Test to follow before Christmas break.

WORLD HISTORY

We have concluded our Chapter on European Culture. I am looking forward to having 7th graders learn about their own heritage. 7th grade will be designing their own Medieval Shield to go along with this chapter. With this project we will continue the study of European History through our study on Renaissance and Reformation.

ENGLISH FRANKOWSKI

6TH GRADE

It's been a pleasure working with the entire sixth grade class. They are an energetic and enthusiastic group. They have recently completed their letter to author and showed outstanding progress. Their next writing assignment will be a personal narrative and is due January 15th.

All students have taken their star assessment test and have received their ZPD and quarterly goals. Each student needs to choose a book and set aside time for weekly independent reading. When they have completed the book, they will take a test at school to receive their points. As a reminder, the quarterly goals are worth 5% of their grade.

7TH GRADE

As a class, an emphasis has been placed on developing each students writing process. This past month they completed their letter to author with an extensive in class pre writing. Their next writing assignment will be a persuasive essay and is due January 15th.

All students have taken their star assessment test and have received their ZPD and quarterly goals. Each student needs to choose a book and set aside time for weekly independent reading. When they have completed the book, they will take a test at school to receive their points. As a reminder, the quarterly goals are worth 5% of their grade.

8TH GRADE

This month we will continue to explore the writing process. We are incorporating strategies from our textbook to improve our writing. Their letter to author showed tremendous growth and I am excited to review their hero essays which are due January 15th.

MATH

MATH 76

6TH GRADE

ALGEBRA I

8TH

6TH GRADE

Algebra 1 students have concluded their study of Unit 3: Relations and Functions. We will begin to take a look at linear equations followed by direct and indirect variations. Please remind your students that they should reach out to me if they need additional support.

Students keep an interactive notebook of covered topics and are expected to have it up-to-date. Interactive notebooks are checked on the day of their math test. I am checking the notebooks to make sure the table of contents is complete, the pages are numbered, worksheet are glued in, and students are actively using notebook by including examples of problems.

We are done with Genetics! This section was fun; there is a lot they got to do to put into practice the theoretical part. They started with a puppy, and we will finish with a 3-generation genetic tree; all I ask for is a picture/ description of grandparents, and parents, the rest will be done in class. Please continue encouraging them to come prepare for class, turn their homework in on time, and follow directions
