BIBLE

6TH GRADE

Happy New Year!!

The next few lessons in Bible Class will focus on character and temptations. Students will be learning about how to handle different forms of temptation and how to make choices that show their character. They will continue to have a Bible verse to memorize and a Bible quiz each Friday. Also, every other week they need to turn in their Bible workbook completed for those two weeks.

7TH GRADE

We have covered through unit 8 in our Bible curriculum. We will prepare for the semester final covering Lessons 1-33 prior to beginning the second half of our texts. Please remind students to study their bible verses and recite them by Friday of the week they are assigned. Bible verses count 100% the week they are due, seventy percent (one week late), fifty percent (two weeks late), and no credit after three weeks. Students are still required to say past due verses, but will receive no credit.

8TH GRADE

As a reminder, the Bible tests are on Fridays and the Bible verses are due on Friday. The lesson is taught on Mondays and Tuesdays. If your student is in choir or misses the lesson notes, remind them to get the notes from a friend or from me prior to Friday's test. This can be done at lunch or study hall. The verses that they are memorizing not only go along with the lessons, but will have a part in graduation.

ENGLISH FRANKOWSKI

6TH GRADE

Happy new year! Sixth grade will continue having weekly vocabulary homework and quizzes on Friday. They have recently began their personal narrative, and I am excited to read them. As a reminder, this paper is worth 12% of their quarterly grade. Feel free to check our class website for any updates.

7TH GRADE

Happy new year! Glad to see everyone returned from a wonderful break. Seventh grade has recently begun their persuasive essay writing assignment, and I am excited to read them. In addition, please remind your student to complete their AR goal by January 18th.

8TH GRADE

Happy new year! Eighth grade will continue to have weekly Vocabulary homework and quizzes on Friday. Recently students began writing their Hero essay which determines who will lay the wreath on the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier. Winners will be announced on February 12th. The goal of the essay is to improve their writing skills and showcase the techniques they are studying in class. Additionally, please remind your student to complete their AR goal by January 18th.

HISTORY

SEDAM

6TH GRADE

GENERAL INFORMATION

Just a reminder- my classroom is open Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays during both lunch periods to students who would like homework assistance or to get a jump start on their homework assignment for the evening.

MATH 6

We are beginning 2019 with our study of Fractions. We will work on fractions and number theory and work our way into adding, subtracting, multiply, and dividing fractions. We will continue to work on mastering multiplication and division. Please continue to have your child review multiplication facts. Students MUST show all their work on homework, quizzes, and tests.

PRE-ALEGBRA

7TH

Students keep an interactive notebook of covered topics and are expected to have it up-to-date. Interactive notebooks are checked on the day of their math test. I am checking the notebooks to make sure the table of contents is complete, the pages are numbered, and students are actively using notebook by including examples of problems.
